The struggle to restrain the increase in taxation, and the assault on liberty and freedom is a constant battle. Proponents of this three prong attack are today mustering their forces to what appears to be a final assault. The blueprint for this assault was officially endorsed by President George H. W. Bush during the United Nations sponsored Earth Summit in 1992.

Every succeeding administration Democrat and Republican with support from the judicial and legislative branches of government, a puppet news media, a lethargic and emasculated pulpit, has helped move this ungodly agenda forward.

The government is not ashamed of its attacks on our liberty and freedom. In fact, their reports published on a five year cycle¹ since 1992, bristle with bureaucratic pride, detailing every aspect of their efforts to change our way of life.

The 2002 report^{1a} provides detailed information on the revised local school curriculum.

Local schools corrupted by the lure of federal grant money willingly teach the tenets of globalization. The teaching process is not limited to the school system. Acquiring the skills to operate in a globalized society requires “lifelong learning”^{1b}.

The globalization process has many names and is multi-faceted – most common are: “sustainable development”, “smart growth”, and “Agenda 21”. During the late 1990s, Cullman County participated in a local Agenda 21 program. It was called Outlook XXI^{1c}. I’ll discuss the updated version of this plan in a few minutes.

Opponents of “sustainable development” are first ignored – then, if they persist, they are vilified and demonized by the opposition. A recent example of the vilification process is the April, 2009 Homeland Security warning that veterans could join with anti-government groups and perpetrate acts of violence.

I oppose globalization, illegal immigration, increasing federal power, restrictions on firearms, abortion and the loss of U.S. sovereignty; therefore, I am by their definition - anti-government.

By demonizing individuals that believe in patriotism, the proponents of globalization are recognizing an awakening of the American spirit. The same spirit during the 1700s threw off the yoke of British tyranny and established a republic of limited self-government.

If given time this reawakening will spread an awareness that “the sole object and only legitimate end of government is to protect the citizen in the enjoyment of life, liberty, and property, and when the government assumes other functions it is usurpation and oppression”².

We, who are concerned about our country, have watched with shock as the President has appointed as close advisors, men who adhere to treasonous and abhorrent ideology. Two examples are:

Van Jones –The Green Job Czar – a self-avowed communist.³ The recent midnight announcement from the White House that Mr. Jones had resigned did not include a proclamation denouncing communism or individuals that espouse the ungodly ideology.

Dr. John Holdren – The Science Czar – endorses the proponents⁴ of eugenics - the process of selective human breeding to produce a superior race for the state. Eugenics was an official policy of the 20th century's most infamous socialist - Adolf Hitler.⁵ Forced abortion⁶ - a current policy of communist China has been endorsed by the Professor. He is also a promoter of “sustainable development⁷.”

The lesson to be learned here sheds light on local community activity.

The President said during his campaign that he will maintain a middle of the road course between the left and right.

The truth, regarding the course established by this administration, is not found in the President's words. The truth lies in the philosophy of his appointees - for they are the ones that author bureaucratic policy and then write the rules and regulations to enforce the policy.

At the local level the globalization process is advancing with minimal opposition. County and municipal governments employ “community planners” (bureaucrats) schooled in the ideology of “sustainable development”.⁸

“Community planners” are the equivalent of the Presidential appointments. They incorporate the philosophy of “sustainable development” into the municipal or county “comprehensive plans” which are adopted as official policy, after adoption “planners” write the enforcement regulations.

In the limited time that I have, I want you to hear the thoughts expressed in Cullman's comprehensive plan⁹ regarding the enforcement strategy. The following is a partial excerpt from pages 74 and 76

“...the city must ensure that every power and every penny is used in support of plan implementation.”

“The city has....critical powers that enable implementation of the plans and policies of this document.”

These powers include:

- police power, *otherwise known as force of arms*
- taxation,
- budgeting and investment, *the ability to spend your tax dollars to fulfill the objectives of the “comprehensive plan”*
- and the use of eminent domain.

The use of police power includes actions that address planning concerns such as

- land use,
- aesthetics, and

actions that insure legal constraints such as

- due process,
- profitable use,

- freedom of speech,
- individual costs vs. public benefit.

I called City Hall this week to enquire about this plan and I was told the planner was no longer employed due to budget restraints. His employment has expired just like Van Jones but not for the same reason. Van Jones, the Green Job Czar, resigned after his communist philosophy became public knowledge.

When the City's budget returns to normal funding, can there be any doubt that a planner will be hired to continue the implementation of the local global agenda?

Our system of government has occurred once in the recorded history of mankind.

I ask you, is this the generation that will lay to rest this experiment in limited self-government or is this the generation that will rekindle the great awakenings of the 1700s and bequeath to the next generation the Providential Blessing that we have enjoyed?
